

fiber. werkstoff für feminismus und popkultur

is a bi-annual magazine published by a young editors collective in Vienna, Austria. This media project aims to represent feminist and queer agency in popular culture, and to publicise the work of women, lesbians and transgender people. Our key objectives are discussing dominant and hegemonic systems, establishing a specific perspective on gender relations within popular culture, and understanding mass/pop culture besides its manipulative character. The magazine includes reviews, articles, and columns; alongside analyses of feminist/queer theory and practice, cultural studies, consumer culture, literature, art and design, comics, net culture, music, film and TV.

fiber was founded in 2002. It is an open editors collective that provides a constant exchange of people, ideas, texts, and images. fiber also hosts events and performances besides its publishing activities - including Rampenfiber, a three-day feminist music festival in 2007, which featured live concerts, discussions and film/video screenings in Vienna.

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
